



within the World Bank project "High Frequency Business Survey" carried out by the Center for Food and Land Use Research at Kyiv School of Economics

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The World Bank is contracting Kyiv School of Economics (KSE) to conduct high-frequency phone monitoring survey of firms to assess the dynamics of the impacts on firms in Ukraine of the RF's military full-scale aggression.

With the onset of the full-scale military aggression of RF against Ukraine on February 24, 2022, the context for private sector development in Ukraine changed dramatically. The impact of the war on businesses and the private sector is significant through various channels, including revenues, costs, availability of supplies, material damage, disrupted trade routes, and displaced customers. It is estimated that the economy has lost 30-50 percent of its productive capacity. Revitalizing the private sector both now and in the long reconstruction period after the war is recognized by the Government of Ukraine as crucial for recovery. The idea of "building back better" is also already highlighted in government national development plans, meaning that sustainable and resilient growth is a priority. The EU accession path will also provide incentives for firms to adapt green and digital solutions.

Although it is difficult to measure fully the impacts of the war, while it is ongoing, efforts to better understand the impacts on the private sector now can help the Government, donors, and multilateral institutions be ready to support firms both now and after the war. Initial figures from the Rapid Damage Needs Assessment estimate that damage to commerce and industry is close to US\$10 billion and economic losses close to US\$47 billion. It is under this context, that the World Bank, in collaboration with government agencies engaged with monitoring and will implement a high-frequency phone survey to monitor the potential negative effects of the war on firms.

JOB DESCRIPTION

All the selected applicants are obliged to participate in the training for conducting this survey. The survey will be organized by KSE with the support of the World Bank. The training will aim at teaching the enumerators how to successfully conduct the interviews and work with the software for recording these interviews. The training will end with an obligatory online test, which will have to be passed successfully. In case the test is not passed, the applicant will enter the waiting list.

The enumerators will be allocated into the groups of 5-6 people. Each group will have a supervisor. The latter will assist the enumerators in their daily activities by providing feedback and advice.

The enumerators will be recording all of the information related to their activities, such as the number of attempts to reach the respondent, the answers, time of the conversation etc. The respective protocols and guidelines will be provided at the training.

The enumerators will be provided with the equipment necessary for conducting the interviews. All interview costs will be covered.
